Grants awarded 2016-2017

## 2017

The Fund received 10 applications, of which three were successful:

- 1. Devon Heritage Centre/Southwest Heritage Trust was awarded £3,000 for the project 'Pike Ward in Iceland exhibitions and research'. The exhibition ran at the Teign Heritage Centre from 27 July 10 September 2017.
- 2. Guðný Einarsdóttir was awarded £2,000 for the project 'Lítil saga úr orgelhúsi' or 'Sally Piper's Big Tootle Day'. Two performances took place at St. Paul's Cathedral and one at the Swedish Church in London in October 2017.
- 3. Turner Contemporary in Margate was awarded £1.000 for the project 'Entangled: Threads and Making' with Icelandic artists Hrafnhildur Arnardóttir (Shoplifter), Margrét H. Blöndal og Arna Óttarsdóttir. The exhibition ran from 28 January 7 May 2017.

## 2016

The Fund received 11 applications, of which three were successful:

- 1. Jakob Jakobsson was awarded £1,500 for the photographic exhibition 'At Work'. The exhibition ran at the Lillie Art Gallery in Milngavie, Glasgow, from 24 September 4 November 2016.
- 2. The Richard Thomas Foundation was awarded £1,500 for two concerts premiering new classical pieces by Icelandic composers Jóhann Jóhannsson and Hildur Guðnadóttir. The concerts were held at Conway Hall in London on 15 and 16 April 2016.
- 3. Inga Lísa Middleton was awarded £1,500 for her art exhibition 'Thoughts of Home', which ran in London in February August 2016.
